



From 1997-2022

Dataset Deficiencies

- The dataset provided DOES NOT include other possible cases in which litigants or claimants may not have had the means to pursue a claim nor the knowledge to submit a complaint against a judge. The claims noted here are only those submitted by individuals who either had counsel and/or had some knowledge of the process, which is probably 99.9% unknown to most U.S. Citizens.
- The dataset DOES NOT address complains by Judge, therefore there is no way to determine how many complains were submitted against a specific judge. In that regard, there is no way to validate that a judge had more than 3 claims against itself, and those corrupted judges are allowed to continue with their corruptive behavior.
- Previous Year list of complains pending never matches the reporting on the next report. Typically, the amount of complains noted as pending is less than the subsequent year.
- Complaints deemed NOT ACCEPTED by the Circuits because they are "duplicated previous filings or where otherwise invalid filings" are excluded from the reports.

1997-2022 SUM of Complaints processed in the past 26 years




This graph provides an overview a breakdown of the complains that were newly received vs. those that were pending from the previous year. The data shows that

1997-2022 SUM of Complaints Dismissed or Denied in the past 26 years




This chart provides a breakdown of cases dismissed or denied by the officers responsible for reviewing the claims ...

- Sixty-nine (69%) of complaints were dismissed by the Chief Judges
- Thirty-one (31%) of complaints were denied by the Judicial Council.

This is a generic level overview based on the data provided on the public reports. This is specifically addressing claims dismissed by either the Chief Judge for each circuit or the Judicial Council.

1997-2022 SUM of Complaints deemed FINALIZED




In the past 26 years, the Judicial Complaints deemed final were ...

- Thirty-five (35%) percent of complaints were concluded.
- **Sixty-four (64%) percent** of complaints were terminated as final.
- Only One (1%) percent of cases were withdrawn.

This is general overview and may be impacted by the fact that the dataset changed drastically in 2008. The data reported is unpredictable and therefore cannot be properly analyzed due to fluctuation in reporting.

1997-2022 Officials complained about ...




This dataset has been gathered since 1997 until present. Minor changes were introduced in 2008 where the national courts count was split into (1) Court of Federal Claims and (2) Court of International Trade. The breakdown denotes that ...

- Fifty-six (56%) of the claims were against District Judges.
- Twenty-four (24%) of the claims were against Circuit Judges.
- Seventeen (17%) of the claims were against Magistrate Judges.

All others are below 5%. The Tax Court dataset was added in 2017 to 2019 and removed in 2020.

This Dataset was introduced in 2008 and the types were later modified to include Judiciary Employees. The breakdown denotes that claims initiated can be broken down into ...

- Fifty-two (52%) by Litigants.
- Twenty-Five (25%) by Prison Inmates.
- Twenty-One (21%) by Lawyers / Attorneys.

All other fields are newer and therefore lack sufficient data. Prior to 2008 no clear records were recorded as part of the reports submitted.




1997-2000 Mental Disability Complaints





- It has nationwide jurisdiction in a variety of subject areas, including international trade, government contracts, patents, trademarks, certain monetary claims against the United States government, federal personnel, veteran's benefits, and public safety officers' benefits claims.
- It also reviews certain administrative agency decisions, including those from the U.S. Trademark Trial and Appeal Board, the U.S. Patent Trial and Appeal Board, the Boards of Contract Appeals, the U.S> Merit Systems Protection Board, the Office Congressional Workplace Rights, the Government Accountability Office Personnel Appeals Board, and the U.S. International Trade Commission.
- It DOES NOT have jurisdiction over any criminal, bankruptcy, immigration, or state matters. In addition, it CANNOT hear appeals from decisions of other U.S. Court of Appeals – those are to be directed to the U.S. Supreme Court.






10th > Complaints Written by Complaints vs. Ordered by the Chief Judge




11th > Complaints Written by Complaints vs. Ordered by the Chief Judge



Overview

- Established under Article III of the U.S.
 Constitution on October 1st, 1982 by the Federal
 Courts Improvement Act pursuant to Article 1 of the U.S. Constitution.
- It has equitable jurisdiction in the areas of bid protect, as well as jurisdiction in vaccine compensation. Its primary purpose is to hear money claims founded upon the Constitution, federal statutes, executive regulations, or contracts, express or implied in fact, with the United States.
- Most cases involve tax refund suits, public contracts, civilian and military claims against the United States by individuals, domestic and foreign corporation, states and localities, Indian tribes and nations, and foreign nationals and governments.










CC > Complaints Written by Complaints vs. Ordered by the Chief Judge


CIT > Cases Dismissed/ Denied from 1997-2022






Issue 1: Ninety-eight (98%) of claims submitted are dismissed



- The process noted under the <u>Judicial</u>
 <u>Conduct and Disability Act of 1980</u> is not working as intended. [See 28 U.S.C. Chapter 16:
 <u>Judicial Conduct and Disability Act Presentation</u>]
- During the 25-year analysis, only two (2) judges made it to the impeachment process. [See Impeachment Process Presentation]
- It is evident that judges are simply protecting each other from prosecution.
 Detail explanation on the meaning for the datasets tied to dismissals is required to fully grasp the rationale for dismissal.


Issue 2: The U.S. Judicial Branch is MONOPOLIZED

- The review of claims is performed by peers only, there is no 3rd Party Assessor in place to validate the claims properly. That leads to bias, prejudice, and nepotism.
- By leveraging Judges ONLY to examine claims peer-to-peer examination the U.S. Judicial Branch is controlling the outcome and therefore fostering corruption for decades. In fact, the process clearly allows judges to think they are untouchable for their lawless behavior as they are protected by the current proces.

The *Black's Law Dictionary, 10th edition, pg. 1160* defines monopolization and monopoly as ...



(18c) The activity or process of obtaining a monopoly. ● In federal antitrust law, monopolization is an offense with two elements: (1) the possession of monopoly power — that is, the power to fix prices and exclude competitors — within the relevant market, and (2) the willful acquisition or maintenance of that power, as distinguished from growth or development as a consequence of a superior product, business acumen, or historical accident. *U.S. v. Grinnell Corp.*, 384 U.S. 563, 86 S.Ct. 1698 (1966). — monopolize, *vb*.

▶ attempted monopolization. (1897) The effort to monopolize any part of interstate or foreign commerce, consisting in (1) a specific intent to control prices or destroy competition in the relevant market, (2) predatory or anticompetitive conduct, and (3) a "dangerous probability" of success in achieving monopoly in the relevant market.

monopoly, n. (16c) 1. Control or advantage obtained by one supplier or producer over the commercial market within a given region. Cf. OLIGOPOLY. 2. The market condition existing when only one economic entity produces a particular product or provides a particular service.

• The term is now commonly applied also to situations that approach but do not strictly meet this definition. — monopolistic, adj. — monopolist, n.
